Ferrari is a name which is famous for racing cars - the name has a luxury sporting image and most models can do 300km/h - the company has never made ordinary saloon cars. But buying a Ferrari is not like buying other cars, because demand for them is so very high. Ferrari limits how many cars each dealer can have, maybe thirty to thirty-five per year, and they usually sell them in three months. There are a lot of very rich people around the world, so there are always people who want to buy a Ferrari but can't get one. Traditionally America was fifty per cent of Ferrari's market, but that is sure to change - Moscow is now home to the most billionaires in the world, and when the new Ferrari showroom opened there it sold all its cars in one day. Roberto Ronchi, the worldwide sales director said "Ferrari does not sell cars, it sells dreams. We are still counting the exact number sold, but we have orders for between 25 and 50 cars." The most expensive Ferrari is the Enzo, which was launched at the Paris motor show in 2002 and costs about one million dollars now. This is a limited edition model - the factory in Maranello, Italy, only made 399 and they were all pre-sold before they were even made. The top speed of this model is 217.5 mph, and it goes from 0 to 60 miles per hour in 3.6 seconds. Ferrari's Formula One cars have traditionally been red. This began in the early days of international racing in Europe when each nation was given a colour, and Italy's was red. Today, most road Ferraris seem to come in red, but this is a modern phenomenon - in the '60s and '70s, other colours were quite common.
