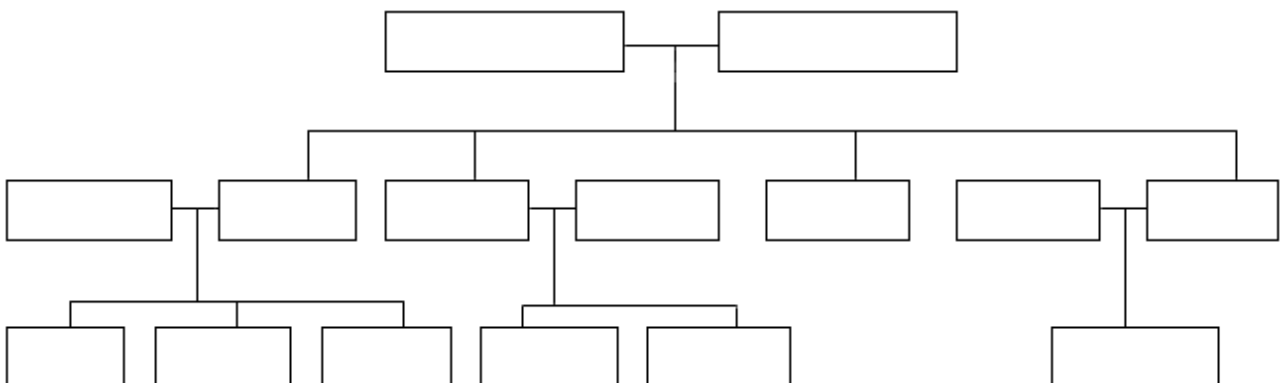

There's a smaller window along the wall that faces east; it's four squares from the corner with the south wall. The chest of drawers is on the other side of the small window, in the corner of the room. The bed is exactly in the middle of the north wall, with the top against the wall. Next to the bed on the left-hand side near the pillow is a bedside cabinet with a lamp on it. The wardrobe is along the west wall, but not quite in the middle – it's three squares from the corner with the north wall. The last pieces of furniture are the desk and the chair. The desk is against the wall in front of the large window and right in the middle of it, so I can look out of it while I'm working. The chair, of course, is next to the desk, in the middle.

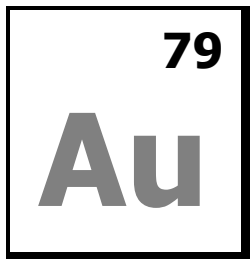
